(Oct. 14, 2021) — Good..., flaming..., grief. We now have for our viewing “pleasure” a brief [video](#) of Kamala Devi Harris – masquerading as a legitimate Vice President of the United States – as she urges some pre-teens to “get curious” about space and learn how to build and use a telescope. This as part of the observation of the U.N.-inspired “World Space Week” taking place each October. Even more bizarre is the fact that Harris does this as the Chair of the National Space Council.

Seriously?

Apart from the “curious” and ironic selection of a Canadian company named “Sinking Ship Entertainment Corporate” to produce the video in apparent partnership with “[YouTube Entertainment Studios, Inc.](#),” the production only underscores the clueless nature of the Goofball Regime and its pseudo-vice president.

Among the more obvious examples of clueless hypocrisy in the video is the toggling back and forth between Harris and the kids wearing masks... then not wearing masks..., then wearing masks again..., then back to not wearing masks, and throughout, ignoring the vaunted CDC “social distancing” edicts. Did they not get the Fauci memo...? Oh, wait, that guy has flip-flopped on masks more times than the Goofball-in-Chief has publicly gaffed, so ignoring him can be forgiven.
