

The Uber White Supremacist

As noted [here](#), it is beyond hypocritical for the Goof to slander and defame Rittenhouse – falsely and with malicious intent – as a white supremacist after [eulogizing](#) a former "Exalted Cyclops" of the Ku Klux Klan, a group synonymous with "white supremacy," as a "friend," a "mentor" and a "guide."
